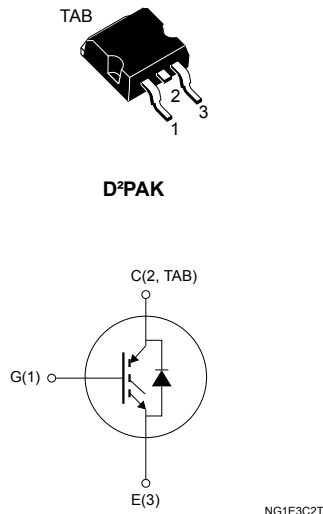


Trench gate field-stop 650 V, 15 A low-loss M series IGBT in a D²PAK package



Features

Description

This device is an IGBT developed using an advanced proprietary trench gate field-stop structure. The device is part of the M series IGBTs, which represent an optimal balance between inverter system performance and efficiency where the low-loss and the short-circuit functionality is essential. Furthermore, the positive $V_{CE(sat)}$ temperature coefficient and the tight parameter distribution result in safer paralleling operation.

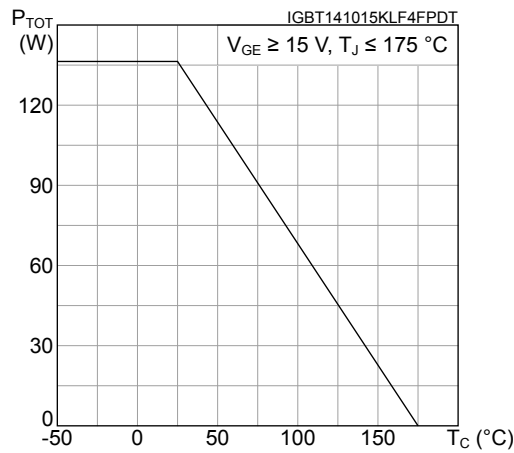
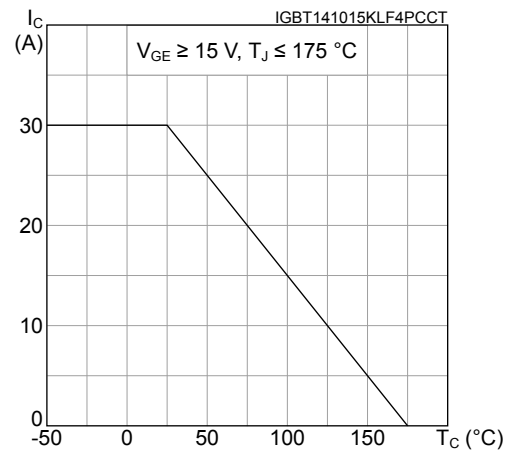
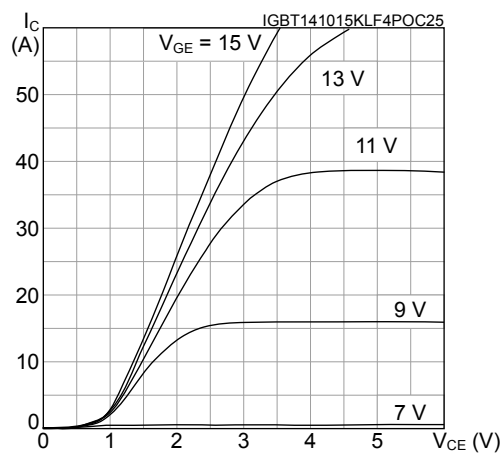
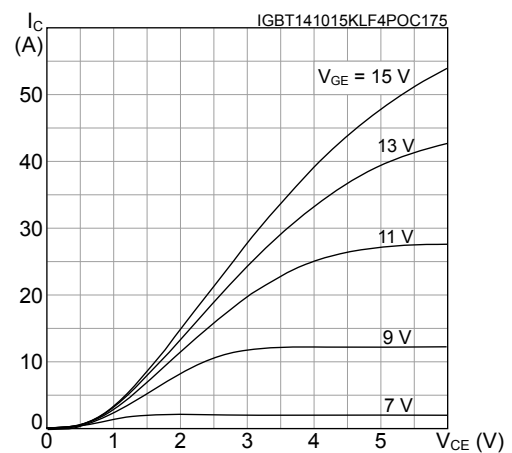
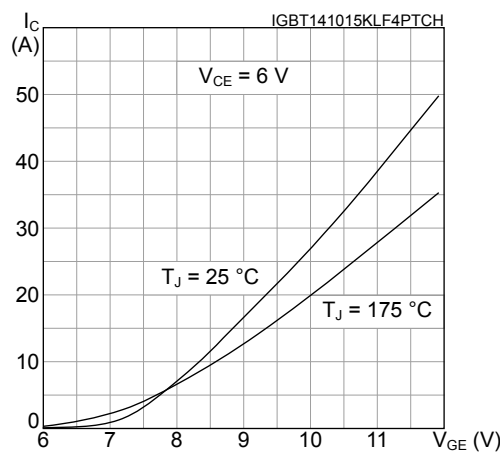
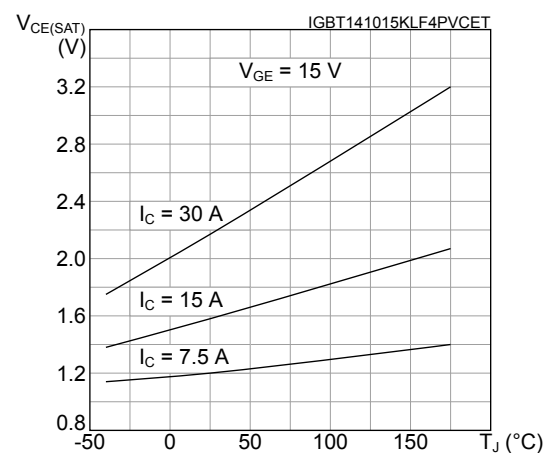
Figure 1. Total power dissipation vs temperature

Figure 6. Typical V_CE(sat) vs temperature


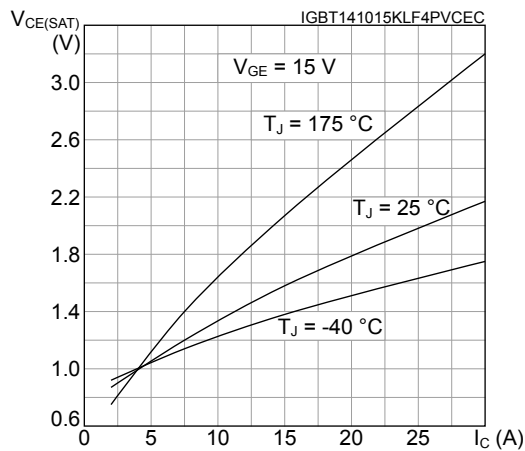
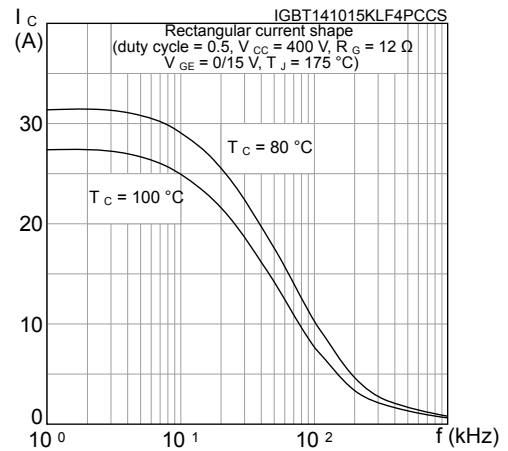
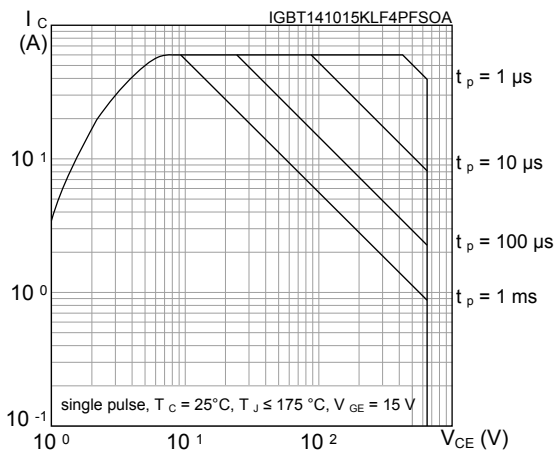
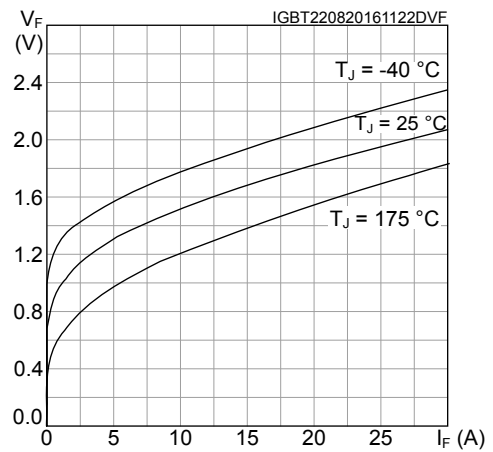
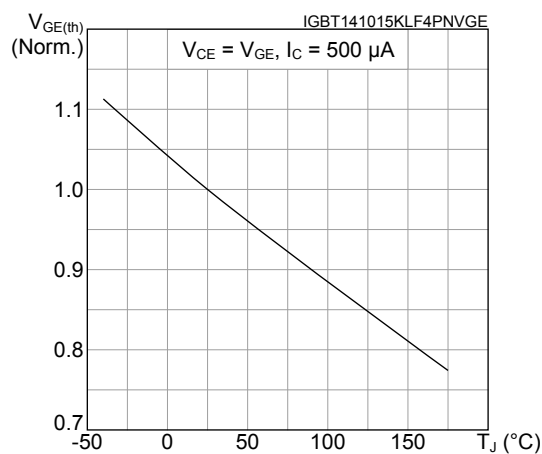
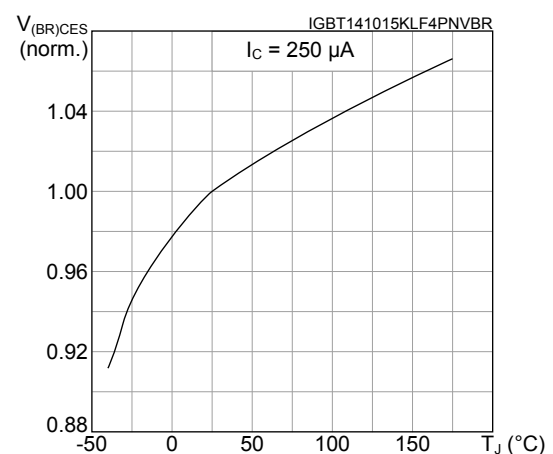
Figure 7. Typical $V_{CE(sat)}$ vs collector current

Figure 12. Normalized $V_{(BR)CES}$ vs junction temperature


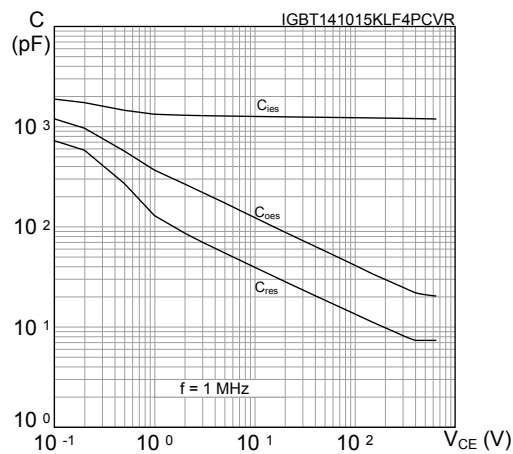
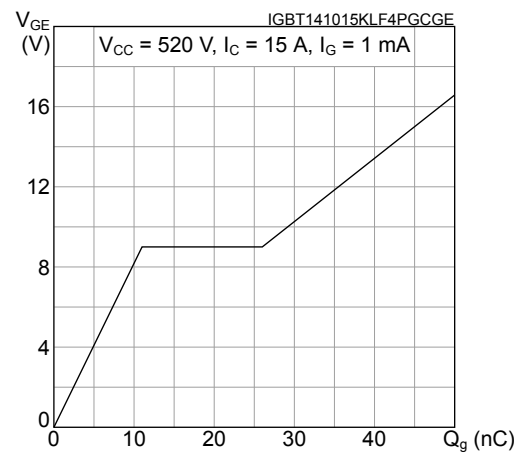
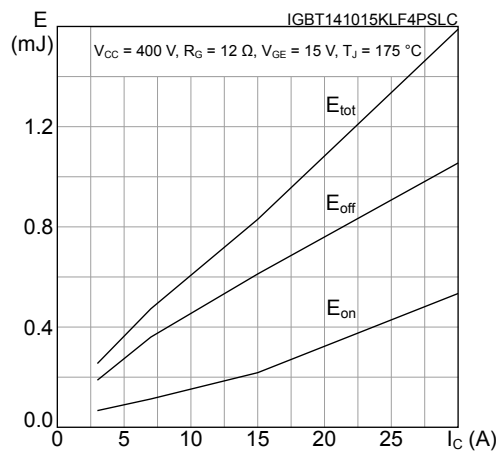
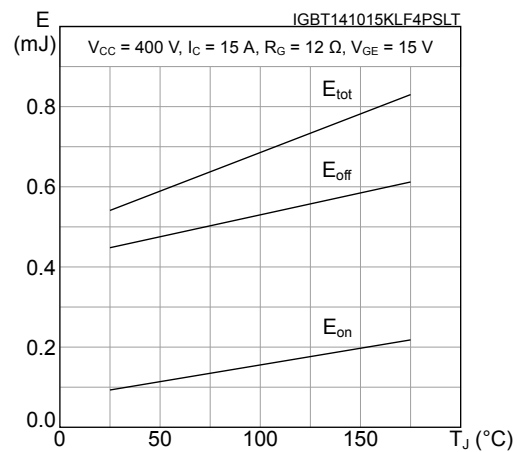
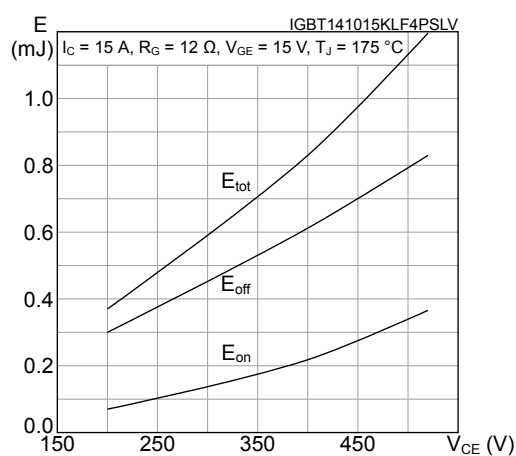
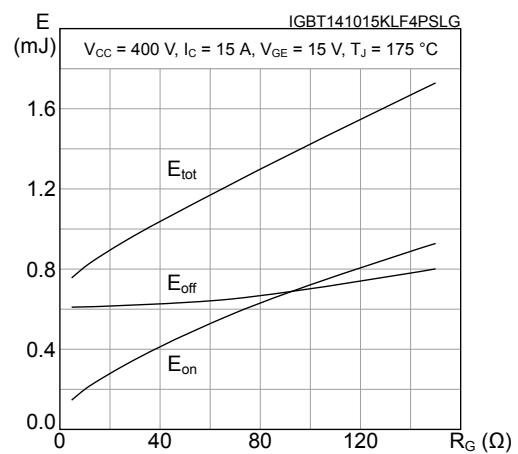
Figure 13. Typical capacitance characteristics

Figure 18. Typical switching energy vs gate resistance


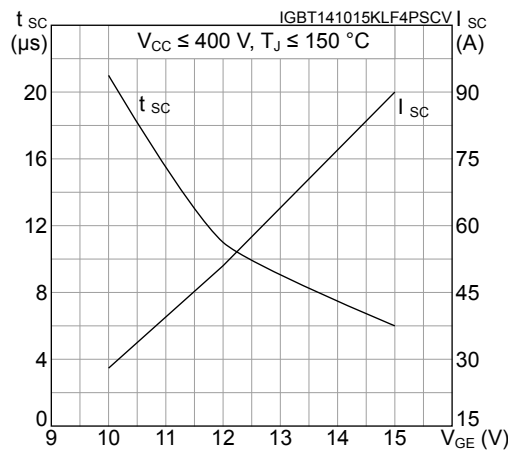
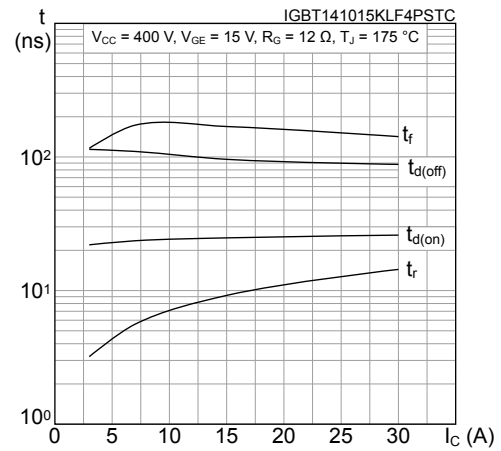
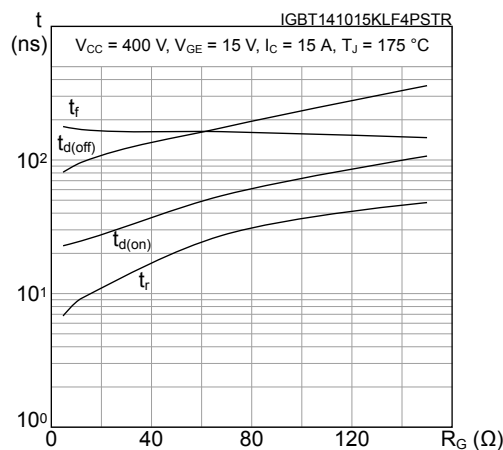
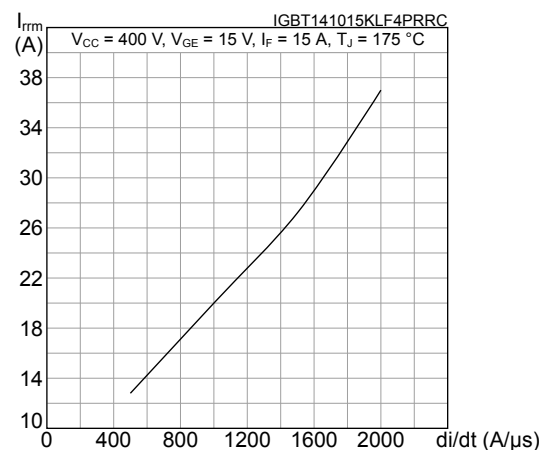
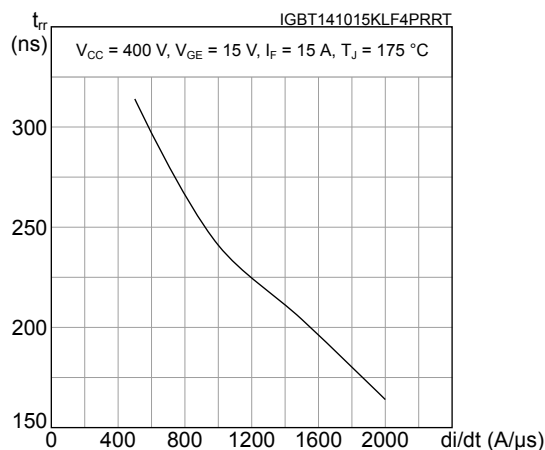
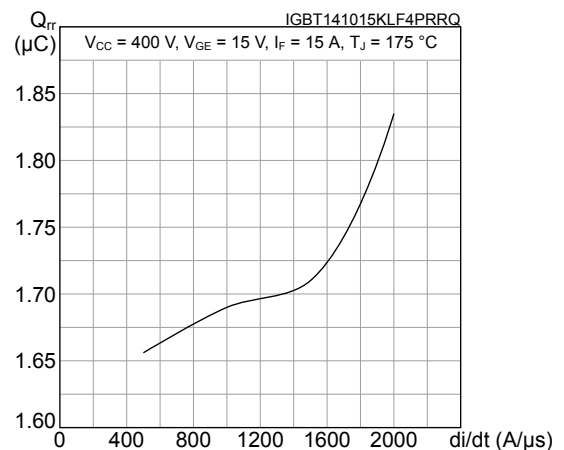
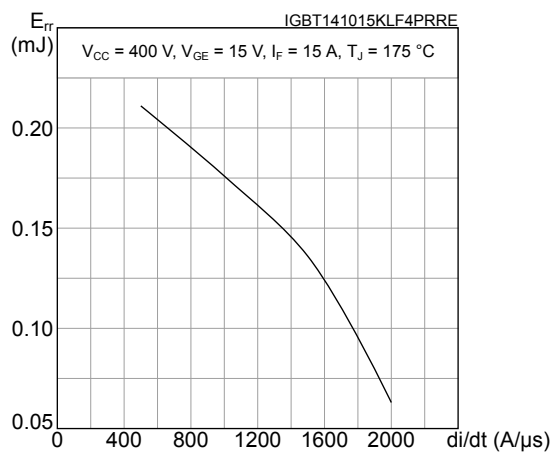
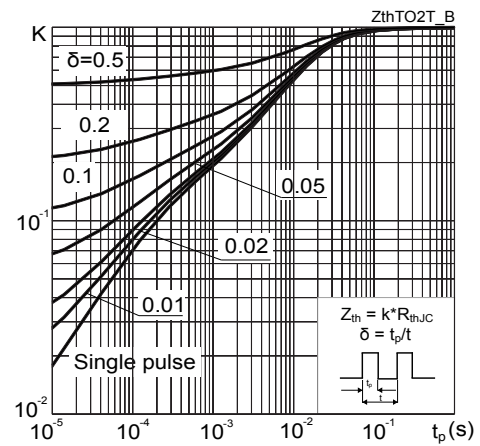
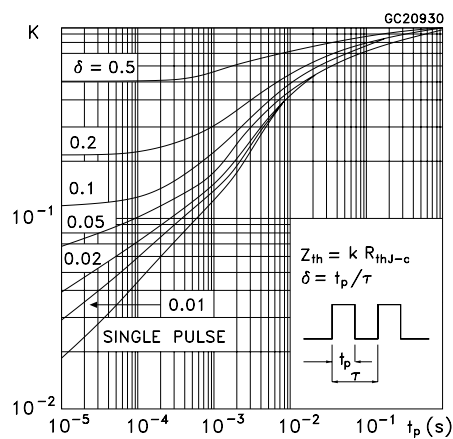
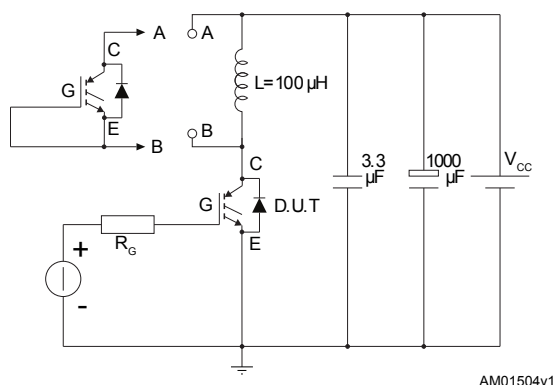
Figure 19. Short-circuit time and current vs V_{GE}

Figure 27. Diode normalized transient thermal impedance


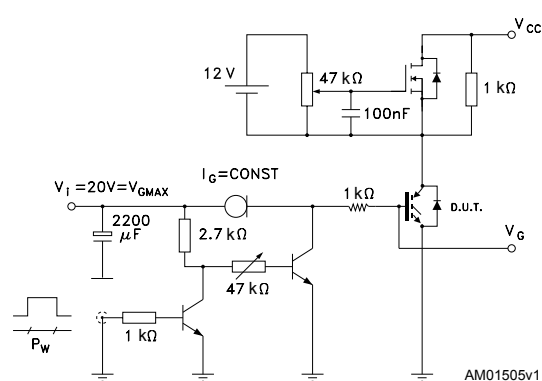

Figure 28. Test circuit for inductive load switching



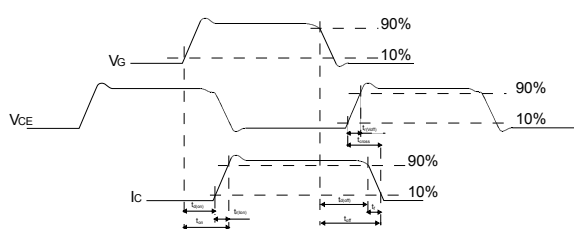
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Figure 29. Gate charge test circuit



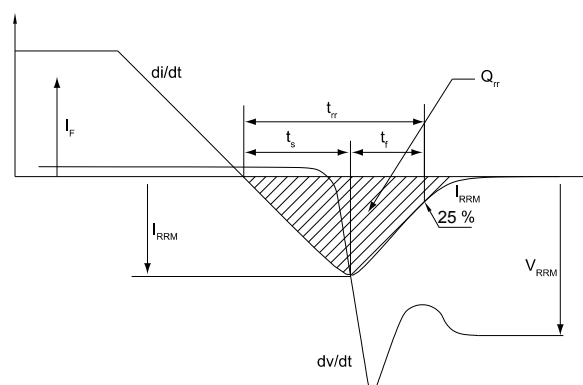
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Figure 30. Switching waveform



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Figure 31. Diode reverse recovery waveform



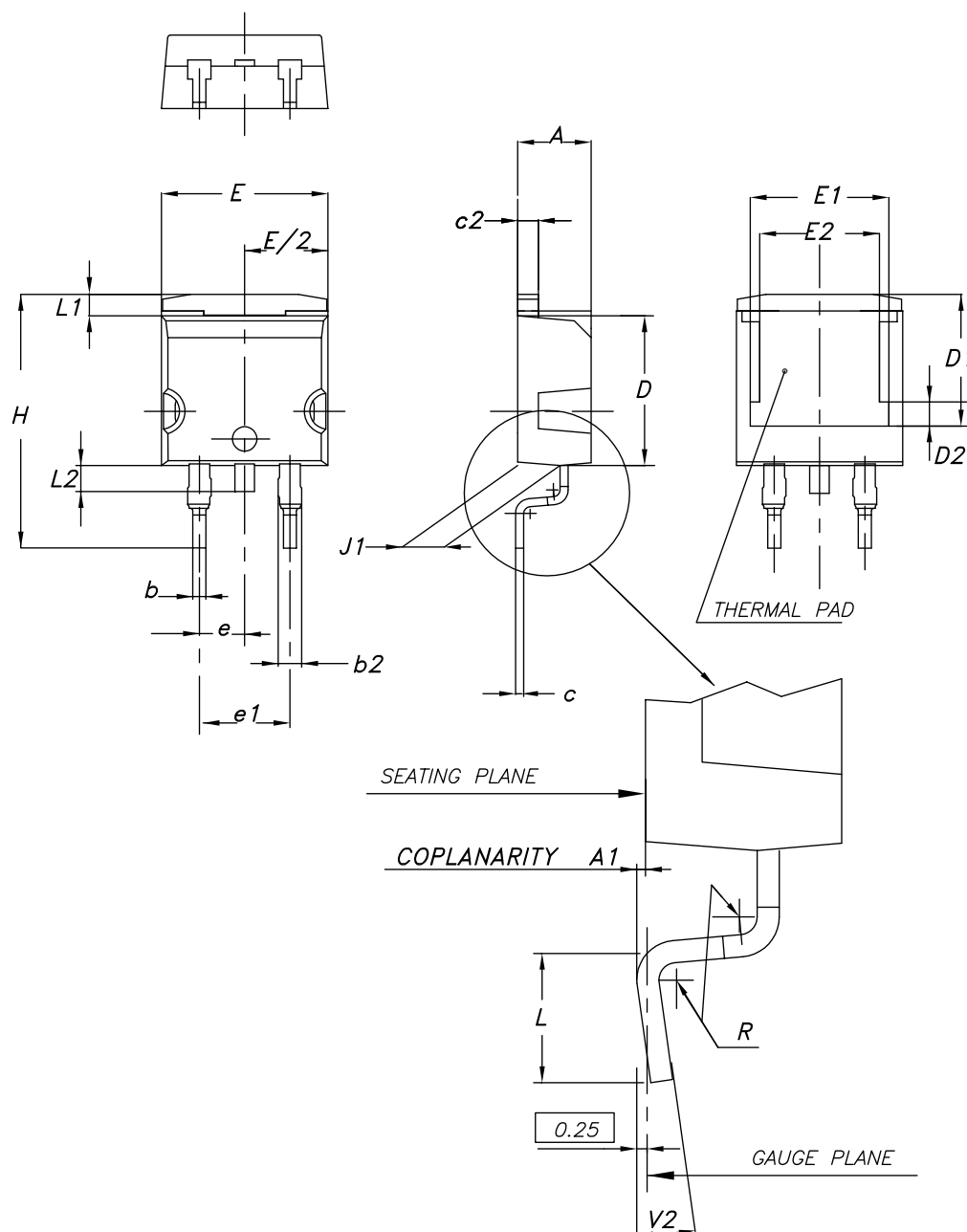

Figure 32. D²PAK (TO-263) type A2 package outline

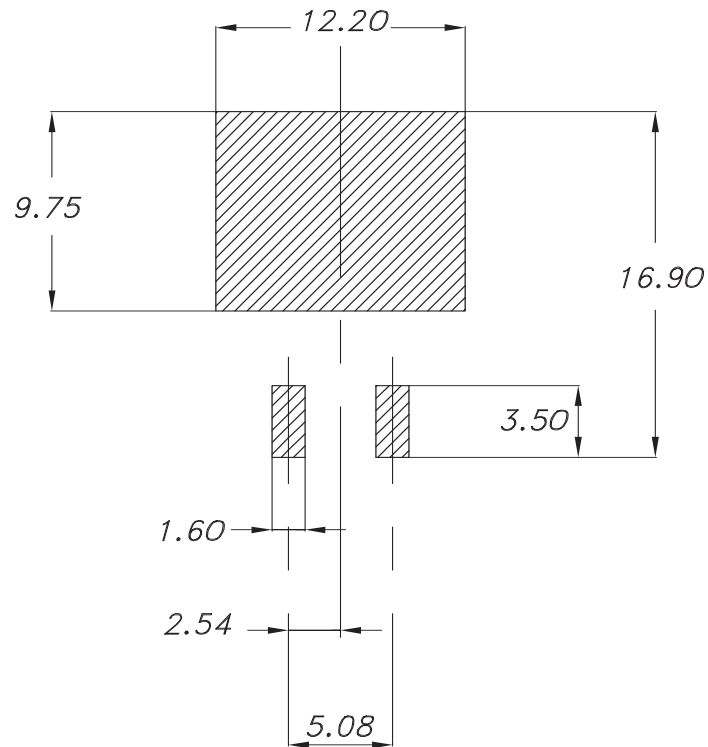

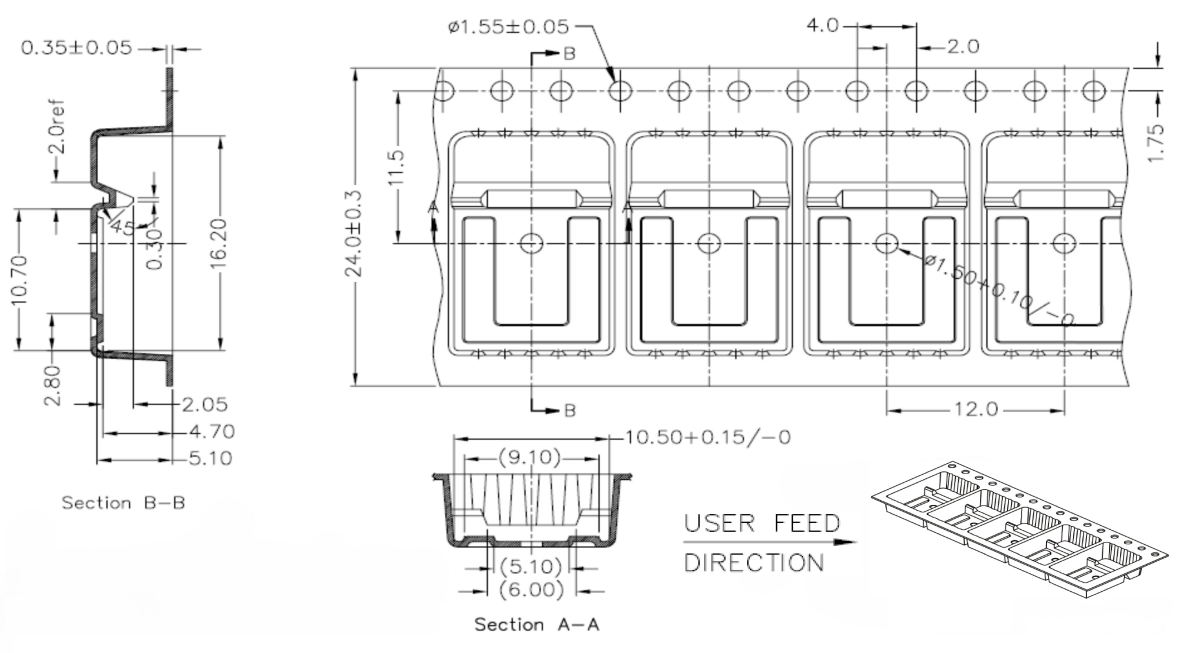
Figure 33. D²PAK (TO-263) recommended footprint (dimensions are in mm)
